

How to help your child succeed in their GCSE's:

- Where possible, ensure that your child works in a quiet space without their phone to minimise distractions.
- Offer to test your child using their flashcards to help them revise.
- Ensure that your child is ready for their weekly tests and mock exams by reminding them of key dates.
- Encourage your child to put their flashcards up round the house e.g. on the fridge or mirrors.
- Using the tasks on Show My Homework, go through the practice questions with your child, checking they have used sentence stems where provided as they need to know these off by heart for their exams.
- Where relevant, ensure that your child has breaks so they are not overloaded by information.
- Encourage and support your child to stick to a revision timetable: two hours per day in 20
 minute chunks, including their homework is appropriate at this stage. Homework is mostly
 revision/practice questions now and nothing beyond what is set is compulsory, but it is vital that
 they stay on top of their homework.
- Encourage your child to attend interventions to help them with their work and to go to their prom.
