




Road Safety Assembly

Teaching & Learning Spotlight - The power of Visualisers

This week, our teaching staff are taking part in some exciting training focused on a piece of technology that is transforming our classrooms: The Visualiser.

A visualiser is essentially a high-tech document camera that allows teachers to project live work onto the board for the whole class to see. While it might look simple, it is one of the most powerful tools we have to support your child's learning.

Why are we focusing on this?

1. Reducing "Cognitive Load" Learning new things can be tiring for the brain. When a teacher verbally explains a complex math problem or a writing technique, students have to hold all that information in their heads while trying to apply it. By using a visualiser to show the work live, we reduce that mental strain (cognitive load). Students don't just hear the explanation; they see it happening in real-time.

2. Enhancing "Modelling" (The 'M' in TEMPO) You will know that our teaching framework, TEMPO, is central to how we teach. This training specifically strengthens the Modelling phase. Instead of showing a "here's one I made earlier" example, a visualiser allows the teacher to act as an expert guide. They can write an essay, solve an equation, or dissect a diagram live in front of the class. This allows students to see the thinking process, not just the final answer, making it much easier for them to replicate that success in their own work.

We look forward to seeing the positive impact this will have in lessons immediately!

Student Leadership

This week we opened applications for student leadership positions in years 9 and 10. Students in year 9 can apply to be prefects and senior students where they can lead the year councils or become House captains.

Year 10 students can apply for those roles as well as Head and Deputy Head student roles.

It is always wonderful to see our students step up into these roles and push themselves, please do encourage your child to apply for these roles.

Year 7 Girls Football Trip

We are delighted to share that the Year 7 girls' football team has won the Swindon Schools Football Association tournament, finishing top out of all the schools in Swindon.

Over the last term, the girls have competed in four tournaments, earning points to secure a place in the top four teams – an achievement in itself. They then went on to win the final tournament in impressive fashion.
