Bike Permits

As our students embrace the independence of riding their bikes, our priority remains safety and security. All students who wish to ride their bike to school must have a **Bike Permit.** A form can be collected from Reception or Student Services. To receive a Bike Permit students must:

- Wear a bike helmet to and from school
- Cycle without wearing headphones
- Ensure they dismount their bike at the top of the driveway
- Lock their bike and helmet securely in the storage area
- Service their bike regularly
- Cycle sensible on their journey
- Display their bike permit tag
- Arrive to lock their bike up by 8.25am at the latest



As of next week this will be monitored and messages sent home of students who do not have a permit.

Home Learning at Kingsdown

Kingsdown's Home Learning programme is focused on helping students embed knowledge for the long term and develop independent learning habits to prepare them for GCSEs and beyond.

Key Details and Expectations

- Workload: Students will receive no more than one hour of home learning per subject, per week.
- Deadline: They are given a full week to complete the work.
- Rewards: High-quality completion is regularly celebrated through the rewards ladder.
- Consequence: Failure to meet a deadline results in a 30-minute afterschool detention.

Support for Students and Parents

- Parent Support: Parents are encouraged to help their child organise their time and check their 'to do list' on Google Classroom each week.
- Study on site: The Learning Lounge (a quiet study space in the library) is open for students from Tuesday to Friday until 3:30pm.
- Wellbeing/Extensions: If a student is worried about completing their work on time, they should speak to their teacher to request an extension for support.
