# Chromebooks



If your child is currently on a day loan or a long term loan and you wish to purchase the device, then please contact [chromebookhelp@kingsdownschool.co.uk](mailto:chromebookhelp@kingsdownschool.co.uk)

The advantage to moving onto a full purchase plan is that your child will not have to return their device before the Summer holiday, and also the device is not locked to the student's school account meaning anyone can log into the device (including parent and siblings) after 4pm on a school day and all day on a weekend/holiday.

# Bike Permits



Students who wish to cycle to school must have a bike permit. These can be collected from student services/ Progress Leaders.

Students who cycle **must** adhere to our road safety expectations. Please ensure your child wears a helmet and cycles safely to and from school.

- Wear a helmet whilst riding to and from school
- Cycle without wearing headphones
- Ensure they dismount their bike at the top of the driveway and walk it to the storage
- Lock their bike and helmet securely in the storage area
- Service their bike regularly to ensure brakes/tyres are safe for road use
- Ensure bikes are fitted with lights in winter months
- Cycle sensibly on the journey, using cycle paths and on the correct side of the road, obeying the highway code
- Display their bike permit tag
- Arrive to lock their bike in time to get to year group zone for Roll Call
