Uniform

Thank you for all of your support with getting uniform right. This is a basic expectation that we expect all of our students to follow. Behaviour updates

To support students in getting it right, there have been some updates to how we log and record data. New achievement logs have been added to the system so that we can celebrate and reward our students getting it right. These new logs are modelled around the Kingsdown BEATs and are for completion of Home Learning, participation in extra curricular activities and for modelling the Kingsdown BEATs. There are new behaviour logs to support students in making the right choices. Students out of lessons during lesson time and without a note in their planner will have an 'unexplained wandering' log. To safeguard our students, we expect no more than 1 child to be in a toilet cubicle, with no more than 4 students waiting in the toilet foyey. If a student is not following these logs up with conversations at home.

Year 11

Year 10 - CAT tests, Mock examinations and support in revising for these

Our Year 10 students did not sit KS2 exams so, in order for us to be able to give them GCSE targets, they will sit three, 45 minute, online Cognitive Ability Tests on **Monday 22nd, Tuesday 23rd and Thursday 25th January**. There is no need for any revision or preparation, but students must bring their laptop fully charged as usual. Form tutors will facilitate the tests during tutor time and period one and students will be briefed in assembly next week.

Parents and Carers of Year 10 students will be aware that the first formal mock exams for these students will commence w/b **Monday 18th March** and run for two weeks.

To prepare students for these assessments, we are inviting in a company called 'Elevate' who specialise in supporting GCSE students with developing their study skills and revision techniques. All Year 10 students will participate in an Elevate workshop on Wednesday 17th January and further details are below regarding their online Parent Support Webinar on Tuesday 23rd January.
