Kingsdown and The River Learning Trust

We joined the River Learning Trust [MAT - Multi Academy Trust] in September 2017. We are very proud to be part of the RLT. We receive regular support from the Trust which includes curriculum development support, professional development for our teachers and professional support staff. There are regular meetings that take place throughout the year for senior leaders as well as subject leaders. We have a RLT support and challenge partner - Mrs Warwick who visits the school every three weeks to review our strategic priorities and supports us with our improvement planning. Paul James is the CEO and he also visits the school every two terms.

Attendance every day and for every lesson

Current attendance for Kingsdown School year to Date is 91.2% with a persistent absence of 24.6%. PA (Persistent Absence) is an attendance of 90% and below.

Uniform reminders

We still have a small number of students coming into school in the incorrect uniform. We have moved to having a morning roll call for Years 7-10. As part of the roll call we are checking uniform. Where uniform is not in line with the uniform policy, students will be loaned the item of uniform and will hand over their phone in exchange. Further removing disruption to learning - changes to Parking at KDS

This week we have modified our parking system to try and help reduce the number of parkings across the school. We have introduced a parking room where students are supervised by a member of staff rather than parking students in other teachers' classrooms. Students who have been parked also spend 15 minutes of their social time in the parking room which is helping to improve the effectiveness of our repair conversations. We have been very encouraged to see that this week we have had a 24% reduction in the number of parkings so far this week.

Year 10 Mocks

Year ten students will begin their exams on Monday 18th March. They will receive an individual exam timetable next week and be given instructions in tutor time about the procedure for attending exams in the Sports centre and expectations regarding conduct in exam conditions. We will write to Year 10 parents and Carers closer to the date with more detailed information. In the meantime, Year 10 students will be receiving information from subject teachers about what to revise and they should remind themselves of their ELEVATE session from January which was all about exam preparation and revision techniques.

Year 11 Mocks

As the second period of mock exams comes to an end this week, we would like to congratulate those students who have really challenged themselves. So many Year 11 students have commented on how much more confident they are feeling with the exam process and with their ability to achieve success. In particular students have identified the 'Blurting' revision technique and the use of past exam papers as being really beneficial in preparing students for exams. Teachers are now in the process of marking and moderating and students will receive their result w/b 25th March.
