## Student leadership

It was a pleasure this week to meet with all newly appointed prefects, senior students and head students. As a group of 46 we know they will take forward and continue the legacy of last year's leadership team who were truly fantastic. Next week a small group of Year 9 senior students will be going with Mr Shepherd to be trained as mental health leads where they will put programmes together with the help of staff to support younger students on their return. Training will also be starting in a couple of weeks for our Year 7 transition ambassadors as well as our new peer education team with students in Years 7, 9 and 10. Our Year 8 sports leaders are doing a great job preparing to lead sessions with students from primary schools which will happen in June.

## Student leadership - BEAT award update

One way all students can demonstrate their leadership ability and skills is with the BEAT award, students are able to demonstrate the BEATs in a wide variety of ways. By completing all criteria within one BEAT students can earn the BEAT badge. By completing the top criteria for each BEAT and 10 other criteria across all BEATs students can achieve the BEAT award. Due to the criteria being for sustained effort this term it has been the first when we have been able to recognise achievement. It was therefore a pleasure last week to be able to give out 202 BEAT badges as well as those students recognised by their tutors. Currently 14 students have achieved the BEAT award and we will look to award these at a special presentation evening in July.

## Student leadership - School council update

We have also had the privilege this week to recognise the students who are on the year councils. This is an important role as they represent the voices of their tutor groups, as a rights respecting school student voice is incredibly important article 12 - talks about the right for young people to be listened to and heard. As a school we take this seriously. Next week in tutor time students will have the opportunity to discuss issues important to them. This will then go to year councils the following week, before school council and SLT before the end of term. Please do encourage your child to participate in these discussions as we really do listen, and this is the way for all students to be heard.

In the last year the student voice coming from council has made a number of improvements to our school some of these include:


- Changes to the ILS and how this works.
