Using toilets - a reminder

At the end of last term Mr Law led on the whole school assemblies around great teaching and learning at Kingsdown School. He reminded students of the importance of the first two minutes when students are asked to complete their DNAs - Do Now Activities. The DNAs are a key part of our recall and retention strategy. He then shared with students the next 10 minutes which we refer to as the Golden Window. It is in this part of the lesson that the teacher shares their expert knowledge through simple, succinct and well designed explanations.

At present we are seeing far too many students being late to lessons due to going to the toilets and then requesting to go to the toilet when vital new learning is being explained. Could you please remind your child of the importance of going to the toilet at breaks and lunchtimes and also using the year group specific toilet blocks. It is also important that there should be no more than four students in the toilet block at any one time.
