Dear Parents / Carers

Kingsdown is part of the River Learning Trust. Each term we receive data and analysis linked to our school's performance and against the 9 other RLT secondary schools. We were thrilled last week to see that our attendance rates are 3% about the average for all other RLT secondary schools. Thank you for all your support in this area. If you need any further support please do not hesitate to get in touch. Student absence can be a real challenge - we understand and are here to support and listen.

Year 11 Mocks - Attendance 92.2%

This week's attendance for year 11 mocks was 92.2%, this is better than it has been so far this academic year but it is still not what we require it to be. We know from our last year 11 data that if your child's attendance is above 95% they will go on to achieve a grade higher in each subject area. We really need you to reinforce to your child that their attendance really matters. If your child's attendance is below 90% they are regarded as persistently absent and will be referred to the Educational Welfare Officer.

We are really pleased that attendance is going up. Thank you for supporting your child's attendance, however our attendance target is 97% which shows there is still a long way to go to achieve this. Please continue to ensure your child is in school so they can continue to achieve and experience the fantastic experiences our school can offer.

Anti-Bullying week highlights the importance of cultivating a safe and supportive environment for our young people.
