### Dear Parents / Carers

Last week I took assemblies for all year groups [minus a few YIIs who were in a mock examination]. My message was about inspirational people and what we can learn from them. I shared one of my inspirations - Diana Nyad - who at the age of 64 years swam across the Straits of Florida - recently her story has been turned into a Netflix film. This stretch of water is 100 miles long, infested with sharks and Box jellyfish and has huge tidal challenges too. She was the first person to swim these treacherous waters outside of a protective cage, a dream she had had since a teenager. A lady with huge resilience, courage, perseverance and ambition and I hope your children were inspired by her story and her qualities. My assembly ended with a reminder to us all about why we have our Kingsdown BEATs and how they tie in with your family's values. Thank you for talking about them at home. There are 6 pages in your child's student planner which outline them in detail.

### Kingsdown School and the Cubbie

We are really excited to share with you that we have installed a 'Cubbie' in school this week. Cubbie's are a multi-sensory space that support students with sensory regulation. They help students with anxiety, stress and support neuro-diverse students who find it difficult to regulate. ### Maths home learning on Sparx

All students complete their maths home learning with Sparx Maths. Sparx is an exciting online platform that provides every student with a personalised home learning experience. We are aiming for all students to have completed their Sparx by Friday at 8am every week.

#### What is Sparx?

Sparx provides personalised homework to each child, with questions that are challenging yet achievable, and tailored to their learning needs. The majority of each week's homework will be based on recently learnt topics, but it will also include some questions from previous topics to help reinforce their learning. Students access their homework online and get immediate feedback for each question about whether their answer was correct or they need to have another try. Every question in Sparx has a support video attached so that your child can get help independently.

Please encourage your child to:

- Have a go at the question before seeking help
- Watch the videos when they get stuck
- Only get help when prompted to do so by Sparx
- Encourage them to start their homework early so they can get help from their teacher at lunchtime Sparx club before the deadline if they get stuck

# Why do students have to achieve 100% completion?

To ensure no gaps form in your child's maths knowledge, homework is not marked as complete until all of the compulsory questions have been answered correctly. Sparx is tailored to each child's level of understanding, and comes with support meaning that every child is capable of achieving 100%. The 100% correct goal is for all schools that use SPARX so students will reap the greatest benefits.

Please check the weekly email you'll get from Sparx and praise your child for starting or completing their homework. If you have any questions then please contact your child's maths teacher and they will be happy to help.

## Help with uniform

We continue to have high expectations with our students and wearing their uniform with Pride. A number of students have tried to wear hoodies into school instead of a coat. Please ensure that during these colder months, students are wearing their uniform (and a coat) in line with the school expectations which can be found on the school website. Hoodies are not a part of the school uniform. If you need support with uniform to ensure it is in line with the uniform expectations, we have a large number of second hand uniform that will be available for you- please contact your Tutor to arrange this.
