We are only ever an email away if **you** need any clarification or support.






## Home Learning & Satchel One(SMHW)

## Bike permits



To ride your bike to school you must have a bike permit. This can be downloaded on the website and handed in by Monday 21st September.

When you arrive to school on a bike, you enter through a different entrance: Go down the path on the far side of Sunrise nursery, walking your bike, not cycling, and in to the bike compound. Once you have locked away your bike you go around the outside of the school to your year group zone.

All Kingsdown students must wear a helmet when riding a bike to and from school.






