Government Announcement - GCSEs Summer 2021

As you may be aware, the Government announced a number of measures to support the students in Cohort 2021 for their upcoming GCSEs. These include:

- More generous grading than usual, in line with national outcomes from 2020, so students this year are not disadvantaged
- Teachers and students will receive advanced notice of some topic areas covered in the GCSEs to allow them to focus their revision
- Exam aids like formula sheets will be provided in some exams giving students more confidence and to reduce the amount of information they need to memorise
- Additional examinations to give students a second chance to sit a paper if they are absent due to illness or self-isolation
- The exam season will begin 3 weeks later than usual to give more preparation time

Action from Kingsdown - GCSEs Summer 2021

As staff, we will continue to provide support and high quality teaching to prepare students for their summer exams. We will

- Provide exam preparation and revision techniques sessions to students before Christmas
- Give clear feedback following December assessments to allow students to focus their revision
- Work with Heads of Department to review our curriculum plans from January
- Continue to provide high quality advice and guidance in preparation for their post 16 journey
- Share updates from exam boards with parents and students about the content of exams - we believe that this will be around the end of January / beginning of February

Support from parents - GCSEs Summer 2021

Being a parent of a child in year 11 can also be stressful. Over the next 6 months, we ask that you

- Engage with your son/daughter's education - as they ask questions about what they need further help with, take note of the data we share with you
- Ensure they have a suitable work space - a quiet space with a desk/table and no distractions
- Ensure they have a healthy routine for eating, sleeping and working
- Support them with revision - test them, quiz them and engage in their learning
- Support them in finding a balance with their time. They should have time for revision and time for themselves too
- Discuss post 16 options with them - engage in discussions about what options they have and how they can apply

We are so incredibly proud of the students in year 11. They have shown maturity, resilience and a positive work ethic. We need them to continue to

- Attend every day, fully equipped and ready to learn
- Plan their time to revise and prepare for January Mocks

Cover mouth if coughing or sneezing




Avoid touching your face

School based social worker project

Monday 7th December marks the start of a fantastic project that we are involved in with Swindon Borough Council. We have been selected to be part of a national project to have a social worker placed within our school. There are 7 other schools in Swindon who are also part of the project. The project is managed by [What Works for Children's Social Care](#) and is an extension of their original pilot. Results and findings can be found in the above link.

The aim of the project is provide early support to children and families within our school community and build a closer relationship between school and social care. Our social worker is called Richard Griffiths who will be fully inducted and embedded into our school ethos, culture and processes. Richard is an experienced social worker who has a good understanding of Swindon and our context. He is really looking forward to working with us and supporting our children and families.
