

Kingsdown learners: we always

- SLANT: sit up, listen, answer questions, never interrupt, track the speaker (look at them)
- 2 DNA: come in and start our task straight away. Use knowledge from our previous lessons
- Cold Call: use thinking time and answer when the teacher asks us a question; no hands up
- 4 Right is Right: listen to the subject specific language and practise using it in our spoken and written answers
- Silent Solo: work on our own and in silence for the whole of the task. Work to the best of our ability
- 6 Tracking not watching: use the feedback that is given to us as our teacher walks around the classroom
- 7 Show Call: watch the improvements being made on the screen and add it to our work to improve our performance
- 8 Home Learning: complete the tasks set and ask questions in advance of the deadline when unsure




