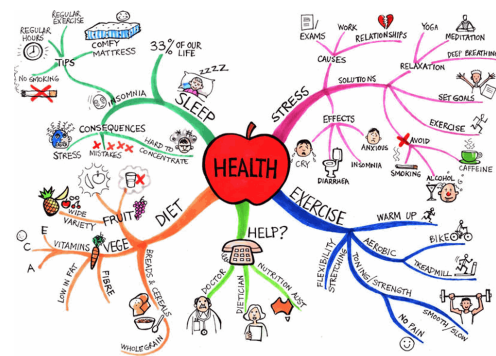
Which modules should your son/daughter revise?

- Biology topics 1, 3 and 4
- Chemistry topics 1-4
- Physics topics 1-4
- Please revise using the Knowledge Organisers on Content and the Required Practicals to help you learn effectively for your 3 Science Exams. These will take place during your lessons on:
 - **Biology exam 24-6-19 -P pop, 25-6 -19 Q pop**
 - **Chemistry exam -25-6-19 P pop, 26-6-19 Q pop**
 - **Physics exam -2-7-19 P and Q pop**
 - **YOU MUST BRING A BLACK PEN, PENCIL RULER AND SCIENTIFIC CALCULATOR TO EACH EXAM**

You can identify these topics by looking at the booklet of knowledge organisers.

What method should your son/daughter use to revise?

1. Your son/daughter should RAG (Red, Amber, Green) each section of the booklet of knowledge organisers recently provided:
 - Green** – Can understand and not recall from memory
 - Amber** – Can understand but not recall from memory
 - Red** – Do not understand and need support from their revision guide and/or teacher
2. Your son/daughter should start by memorising everything in the booklet of knowledge organisers provided that are rated amber. Effective methods for memory retention include:
 - Reading, covering, writing, reading, covering, writing. Until this can be written without peaking.
 - Drawing mind maps to link the content together.
 - Creating quiz cards with a question on one side and the answer on the other side. Being tested on these.
