Safeguarding at Kingsdown



A Warm and Welcome Space is a council or community venue available to residents to visit to spend time, stay warm and feel safe. These spaces are open to anyone. Visitors won't be asked why they are there and won't have to take part in any activities if they don't wish to.

The facilities at each venue will vary – some venues may offer hot drinks, free Wi-Fi or activities may be taking place. The services at each space could include:

- further support with the cost of living
- opportunities to participate in activities
- free internet access, computers and charging points
- a friendly environment to connect with others within the community

These spaces will be available for people to use and visit during the winter period and beyond.

Reading Curriculum - Our T D Day

The two TD Days this term were focussed on reading at Kingsdown. Reading is a vital skill for improving examination outcomes as well as success beyond school. During the two days staff received extensive training about the creation of a reading curriculum and its delivery in all subjects as well as time for further curriculum development. This is to ensure that our most able readers are stretched and challenged and those whose reading ages are not yet in line with their chronological ages are supported to accelerate their progress through the universal curriculum offer. Through this provision and its expert delivery, students will deepen their knowledge as well as develop their reading skills, whatever level they are working at. Thank you for continuing to champion reading and supporting your child with reading at home.

Road Safety

We were all so saddened to hear of the tragic accident last week where a member of our community and a student at Nova Hreod academy lost their life. As the nights and mornings are growing ever darker, please can I remind our students of the importance of being alert on their journey to and from school and whilst out in the community, this means phone away, ear pods out and be aware of the hazards around them. The footpaths are very narrow as you walk further down Ermin Street, so please walk in double/single file where necessary. Students who choose to ride a bike to school must have working bike lights and be wearing helmets. Your child's safety is our number 1 priority.

Sporting Engagement and Teamship - Head of PE up-date

It has been a busy yet successful two weeks for PE. We had a fabulous Swindon schools cross country championship where the students showed stretch and challenge throughout some tough races. In the year 7 girls race, our year 7s girls Natalia, Zara and Izzie finished strong with Zara finishing 6th and Izzie finishing 5th. Year 7 boys also competed well with Kayden the pick of the day finishing 17th. Year 8 and 9 girls also ran a good race with Sophia finishing 9th and Ella finishing 16th.
